2. Jack Coia was announced as the architect of St Bride's on 1st May 1954. He described the chosen site on Whitemoss Avenue as being "admirably placed for a church" and "the finest site he had ever been given". In fact it would be his assistants, Andy MacMillan and Isi Metzstein who would do most of the designing of St Bride's.
