**Children's Liturgy**: 9:30am Mass on Christmas Day will be a Family Mass with Young Readers. Children's Liturgy will resume on Sunday 15 January in the Parish Centre

**St Hilary's Primary** raised £450 for the Kilbryde Hospice through the Advent Appeal.

**St. Kenneth's & St. Hilary's:** Over the period of Advent, St Hilary's Primary and Nursery School have been actively involved with Loaves and Fishes, a local food bank charity. Through their work in the Pope Francis faith Award, primary 7 pupils have continued to develop their leadership role and promoted the food bank among all the pupils in the school. St. Kenneth's Primary showed the same generosity at this time of the year when all the students prepared many food parcels which were happily distributed by the SVDP from our parish.

Children's Liturgy Leaders: Leading Children's Liturgy is a very fulfilling experience. The Leaders conduct prayers, readings and activities especially for Primary School children over the first 20-25 minutes of the Sunday Mass at 9:30am, which mirrors the adult Mass at that time. The children return to Mass at the Offertory. Over the last 12 months, five of our Leaders have stepped down due to a variety of personal circumstances, which leaves us with only eight leaders. This makes it difficult to cope, because the Leaders have other commitments which means they are not able to come each week. We also want to offer sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion in January and February 2017, but even with the assistance of High School students in these activities, it will be difficult to continue to deliver Children's Liturgy as we do at present, unless more leaders come forward. With more leaders, we can operate a rota system, so it is not a commitment for every Sunday. Speak to Father Rafal, Deacon John or one of the Leaders if you want more information.
