

This Sunday we celebrate The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord: *The Gospel narrative and the text of Isaiah together shape our traditional crib scene of kings, camels and lavish gifts. But the feast celebrates revelation itself. The Wise Men's search, guided by the light of reason, takes them only so far. Only an encounter with Scripture – divine revelation – can perfect it, and lead them to find and worship the divine child. Our human capacities need to be enlightened by divine revelation to lead us to God and to Christ, the light which enlightens all of life.* There will be a **Special Collection** at all Sunday Masses for **Justice and Peace,** and a letter will be read at all Masses.

Year of Mercy: Bishop Toal formally opened the Jubilee 'Door of Mercy' at Carfin on Friday January 1st. He encourages us to <u>sing</u> the 'Lord have mercy' or 'Kyrie Eleison' at all the Masses during the Year of Mercy.

The Children's Liturgy programme will restart on 10th January, including The Big Hug programme which will run for from 10th January for 4 weeks as part of Children's Liturgy for the children preparing for their First Confession.

St Bride's Parish Review of 2015

After nearly 5 years serving our parish, Fr Ness was transferred by Bishop Toal to St Benedict's and St Clare's in Easterhouse. In June, Fr Bill Bergin was appointed Administrator to the parish, and he arrived with us at the end of July. Sadly Fr Bergin became ill in October and during his convalescence we have been ably served by Fr Rafal Sobieszuk from St Joseph's in Blantyre. We have been most grateful for support throughout the year from Bishop Joseph Toal and the priests who have celebrated our daily and Sunday Masses including Fr Jim Grant, Fr Andrew Clark, the Xaverian Fathers, the Spiritans (Holy Ghost Fathers), Fr John Clark of the Comboni Missionaries (Verona Fathers), Fr Eugenio Montesi, Fr Frank Dougan, Monsignor Thomas O'Hare, Fr Patrick Hennessey, Fr Gerard Chromy, Fr Stanislaw Pamula, Fr Benedict Mayindwe and especially Fr Liam O'Connor for his support throughout the month of June and Fr Desmond Keenan who led our Lenten retreat. January saw the resignation due to ill-health of housekeeper Ann Marie O'Donnell, and the appointment of Lucy Mikurdova to this post. With great sadness we learned in November of Ann Marie's death. We also mourned the loss this year of a number of our longest-serving parishioners.

Special Parish Liturgies included a Baptism Mass on 25th January 2015 (for families of all children baptised in the parish in 2014); a Harvest Thanksgiving Mass on 27th September; and the Annual Mass for Deceased Parishioners 25th November.

In January training was provided for the Readers' Ministry by Fr Stephen Reilly and his pastoral team.

We launched our subsite <u>www.sbek.org/building</u> to track the progress of the renovations, and our Twitter account @StBrideEK.

In February we congratulated Fr Bill Nolan on his ordination as Bishop of Galloway; and Fr Stuart Parkes on his appointment as parish priest to Our Lady of Lourdes. Morning Mass was celebrated at 7am in the Church each weekday throughout Lent and at 8.20am in the school.

On Palm Sunday the Parish Library for Children was launched and has proved popular with our young parishioners.

At the Easter Vigil we began using our new Book of the Gospels with its ornate silver cover – both gifted by parishioners; and Tom Walton was received into full membership of the Church

Deacon John and Rosaline walked part of the *Camino* to Santiago de Compostela in Spain, and attended a retreat for Deacons and wives in Salamanca. In October, Deacon John was appointed by Bishop Toal to assist in the Chaplaincy Service at Hairmyres.

Our Children and Young People

The Children's Liturgy programme was expanded and now runs throughout the school year, including Sacramental Preparation for pupils from St Kenneth's and St Hilary's primaries. Once again parishioners acted as prayer partners for the children in their sacramental preparation. The Legion of Mary visited families whose children had registered with the parish for First Communion. A monthly Family Mass at 9.30 on Sundays is now led by the young people. The Children's Christmas Party on Gaudete Sunday was a resounding success! Pupils from both St Kenneth's and St Hilary's P6 enrolled in the "Pope Francis Faith Award" programme, and High School students from the Caritas group supported parish social and spiritual events throughout the year. Retreats for S2 students throughout February were supported by Fr Ness and Deacon John

Parish Life

The Thursday "Coffee Morning Mass", the Christmas lunch for 120 in the Hall, and the buffet lunch in May continue to be central features of the parish social life. The holiday group enjoyed trips to the Lake District and Derbyshire, and The Third World Group ran two successful fundraising quiz nights in the hall – but with great sadness we mourned the death of quizmaster Brian Carson in November.

Our Church building

With the help of our newly-formed Fabric Committee and Parish Together Committee, our focus was on planning and fundraising for the renovations scheduled to take place in 2016. In July, we celebrated reaching our first fundraising target of £102,000 – the "third party contribution" necessary to allow us to receive a £1m grant from Viridor Credits. Fundraising events included a "Sportsman's Dinner" and a "Basket Tea". Parish Meetings and regular printed updates kept parishioners informed about the Renovation project, and throughout the year visits from architects and students reminded us of the international significance of our building. Work started on the kitchen extension to hall, and in the church we completed a programme of "minor works" including installation of new external doors; upgrading of toilet facilities: installation of a wheelchair ramp: relocation of the piety stall; and removal of the glass screens and installation of new pews in the side chapel.

The Wider Community

Monthly Masses were celebrated at Cathkin, Kingsgate, McKillop Gardens and Acorn Park Homes, with the support of the Legion of Mary.

We continued to support the Food Bank in co-operation with Calderwood Baptist Church and East Kilbride Community Food Bank.

As well as a number of Special Collections we also supported charitable appeals for St Margaret's Children and Family Care Society; the Ebola Crisis Appeal; SCIAF – (Nepal Appeal £2,254.27 and Wee Box collection which with Government Match Funding doubled up to £12,948.02); Mary's Meals; Ross and little Kaitlyn Mullen's fundraiser for a Ghana High School; the Comboni Fathers; and Macmillan Cancer Care; and we also contributed to our Third World Group; hosted a Martin Aelred concert in aid of *Let the Children Live*, and generously provided Christmas Gifts for underprivileged children in Easterhouse.

We joined with our Christian neighbours in participating in the Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity, hosted here in St Bride's; The World Day of Prayer in the West Kirk; and The Ecumenical Lenten talks, also hosted at St Bride's this year. Deacon John continues to liaise with other faith groups in the town, including the East Kilbride Church Leaders Group and "Christians against Poverty".
