

A Word from Pope Francis: Aperuit Illis, Sunday of the Word of God.

On 30 September 2019 the Holy Father published an Apostolic Letter, Aperuit Illis, instituting an annual Sunday, the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, as a Sunday of the Word of God. Your attention is directed especially to paragraph 3 of the Letter: "Consequently, I hereby declare that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the word of God. This Sunday of the Word of God will thus be a fitting part of that time of the year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity. This is more than a temporal coincidence: the celebration of the Sunday of the Word of God has ecumenical value, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, the path to authentic and firm unity". The various communities will find their own ways to mark this Sunday with a certain solemnity. It is important, however, that in the Eucharistic celebration the sacred text be enthroned, in order to focus the attention of the assembly on the normative value of God's word.
