Sunday 24 May 2020 Seventh Sunday of Easter - Year A



Holy Mass is being streamed live every morning at 8.00am Holy Hour and Rosary are being streamed live on Thursday at 7.00-8.00pm The Novena to the Holy Spirit began on Friday 22 May.

This Sunday is World Communications Day.

Feast Day: Tuesday 26 May: St Philip Neri.

31 May is the Bishops of Scotland's Day for Life.

The Church is taking some action at the national level to prepare for a staged reopening of our Churches. These include materials for cleaning and disinfecting our church; masking tape will be useful to mark out areas of our church for physical distancing; hand sanitisers at the entrance and a face covering for people. We will have to observe the physical distancing of 2m. Our general rule of thumb is that this typically results in about 20 to 30 percent of the total capacity of our Church. There will some changes when entering and leaving our church. We will be using a separate entrance (only the door near the stall) and exit (only the door near the sacristy). We will think about the numbers who attend typical Adoration and Masses, and estimate how many people will be able to come at any one time. We will be cleaning and disinfecting high-touch surfaces in common areas after each use. There is good evidence based advice on how to sew homemade face coverings at: <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/diy-cloth-face-coverings.html">https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/diy-cloth-face-coverings.html</a> and there may be volunteers willing to sew these.

**Poland 2020:** Our trip/pilgrimage to Poland at the end of May this year has to be cancelled or postponed. We will meet as a group when it is possible to decide whether we want to cancel it or postpone it (Autumn 2020 for example).
