THE CHRISTMAS SEASON CONTINUES TODAY

Today is the Octave Day or Eighth Day of Christmas - in the current liturgical Calendar only Christmas and Easter enjoy the privilege of an Octave. In the Bible the number 'seven' is the perfect number; seven plus one represents the ultimate perfection, God himself. To show the importance of these two feasts, they are celebrated for eight days.

As such, the Christmas Season continues today with the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. We honour Mary's motherhood, her greatest privilege. She was given the Greek title *Theotokos* - the God-Bearer - by the Council of Ephesus in 431AD. Today is also the fifty-seventh World Day of Prayer for Peace.

THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

We are all familiar with the Christmas song 'The Twelve days of Christmas'. To most it is a delightful nonsense rhyme set to music. But it had quite a different purpose when it was written. Between 1558 and 1892, Catholics in England were prohibited by law from practicing their faith in any public way. 'The Twelve days of Christmas' was written as one of the 'Catechism Songs' to help young Catholics learn the tenets of their faith - a memory aid, when to be caught with anything in writing indicating adherence to Catholicism would mean automatic imprisonment.



The 'true love' mentioned in the song is not an earthly suitor but God himself. The 'me' to who the gifts are given is every baptised person. The Partridge in a pear tree is Christ. He is symbolically presented as a mother partridge which feigns injury to decoy predators from her helpless nestlings. Remembering the expression of Christ's sadness over the fate of Jerusalem as he travelled along the streets of Jerusalem in the direction of Calvary: "Jerusalem! Jerusalem! How often would I have sheltered you under my wings, as a hen does her chicks, but you would not listen!"

- 4 Calling Birds the four Evangelists.
- 5 Gold Rings the first five books of the Bible known as the 'Pentateuch'.

- 8 Maids a-milking the eight Beatitudes (Happy the poor in spirit...).

CALENDAR

On Monday we remember Saint Basil the Great (+379) and Gregory Nazianzen (+389). Both theologians of the Eastern Church, they were also the best of friends from school days in Athens. Basil's monastic rule serves as the ideal for monastic life in the East. Gregory's



remains lie in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. Tuesday is the memorial of The Holy Name of Jesus. Devotion to the Holy Name is deeply rooted in the Bible, especially in the Acts of the Apostles. It was promoted in a special way by Saint Bernard and Saint Bernardine, and extended to the whole Church in eighteenth century. January has traditionally been dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus.

Wednesday is the memorial of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton (+1821) pictured. Born in New York, Elizabeth Ann Bayley married William Seton and they had five children. After her husband's death from tuberculosis, she converted to Catholicism and founded the American Sisters of Charity, a community of teaching sisters which began Catholic schools throughout the United States, helping with the

education of underprivileged children. Mother Seton laid the foundation of the American parochial school system and was the first native-born American to be canonised. **Thursday** is memorial of **Saint John Neumann** (+1860). John was born in Bohemia (current Czech Republic). While in the seminary he felt a desire to help in the American missions. After going to the United States, he was ordained in New York in 1836. Entering the

Redemptorists in 1840, he worked in establishing parishes and parish schools. In 1852 he was consecrated Bishop of Philadelphia. It was a snowy afternoon on the 5th January 1821, when he collapsed and died on the street as he made his way back to the Cathedral.

NEXT SUNDAY - IS THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY



The Epiphany or the 'manifestation' of Jesus to the Gentiles - who were represented at his birth by the Three Wise Men - is celebrated next Sunday. The Proclamation of the 'Kalenda' (the Calendar of Major Feasts for the New Year) will be read at all Masses next weekend.

There will be a retiring collection to help support the Justice and Peace Commission of the Bishops' Conference of Scotland.
