SAINT ANTHONY OF PADUA

Tuesday 13th of June is the feast of Saint Anthony of Padua. He is one the most popular saints: the great attendances at the weekly Novena in Blessed Duns Scotus Church in the Gorbals are a testimony to this. Saint Anthony was born at Lisbon, Portugal, in 1195. He became a Franciscan and lived for a time in France, but chiefly in Italy, where he died at Padua in 1231, at the age of 36. He was admired for his genuine sanctity. From the day of his death, innumerable miracles caused the faithful to invoke him as a 'wonderworker of great benevolence'.



We are fortunate to help a beautiful carved statue of Saint Anthony in our Church, given by the family of the late John Wright, a former Provost of East Kilbride.

Saint Anthony is renowned for four things:

As a **FINDER OF LOST THINGS** - Saint Anthony possessed a book of Psalms that had great sentimental value to him. A wayward novice decided that he had enough of the religious life and left the Friary with the book. Saint Anthony prayed for the book to be returned. The thieving novice was moved with pity and returned to the Friary with the book. Hence the reason people pray to Anthony when they lose something!

SAINT ANTHONY'S LILIES - In many places lilies are blessed on the feast. The lily is a symbol of Anthony's purity and of our need to pray for the grace of purity in times of temptation.

SAINT ANTHONY'S BREAD - In 1263, a child was seriously ill after falling into a river near the Basilica in Padua. His mother promised that if the child was restored to health, she would give an amount of corn, equal to the child's weight, to the poor. Her prayer was heard, and the child was returned to full health. Today, promising to give alms in honour of Saint Anthony, if a favour is granted, is called 'Saint Anthony's Bread'. Just behind the statue of Saint Anthony in our Church is the 'Saint Anthony's Bread Box'. Many people use it when favours are granted to them through the intercession of Saint Anthony.

THE BIBLE - Saint Anthony was the first teacher of the Franciscan Order, appointed by Saint Francis of Assisi himself. He taught the young friars Scripture, amongst other things, as long as it did not interfere with their prayer time. When he was canonised by Pope Gregory IX, he was referred to as the '*Arca Testamenti*' that is to say, the 'the Ark (Repository) of Holy Scripture".

THE CHILD JESUS - One night while staying at the house of a nobleman, Anthony was praying when Christ appeared to him as a young child. The room was filled with bright light, which illumined the whole house. It woke the Baron Chateauneuf, who witnessed the apparition. For Saint Anthony, poverty was a way of imitating the Christ-child, who was born in poverty in Bethlehem.

The Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Thursday 29th of June, is a Holyday of Obligation, a day when we are expected to be at Holy Mass. Holy Mass will be celebrated at 10am and 7pm. Please note that there will be no Vigil Mass because of the Novena to Our Lady Untier of Knots.



FRIDAY - SOLEMNITY OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Friday is the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It is a moveable feast - designated to be celebrated on the Friday after the Second Sunday of Pentecost. Sixteenth century Calvinism (Geneva Protestantism) and seventeenth century Jansenism (a heresy) preached a distorted view of Christianity: they substituted God's love and the sacrifice of his Son for all people, with the

fearful idea that a whole section of humanity was bad and destined for eternal damnation.

The Church always countered this view with the infinite love of Our Lord who died on the cross for all people. The Feast of the Sacred Heart soon contributed to a powerful current of devotion which since then has grown steadily stronger. The Divine Office texts and the texts for Mass of the Sacred Heart were composed by the French priest, John Eudes, but the feast itself was a result of the appearances of Our Lord to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1675. The celebration of the Feast was extended to the Universal Church by Pius IX in 1850s.

On Friday morning we will celebrate a Solemn Mass, with incense and organ, to mark the Feast. Please join us if you can.

MASS FOR THE SICK

On Thursday 22nd of June, the Feast of the English martyrs Saints John Fisher and Thomas More, we will have a special Mass during which the Sacrament of the Sick will be given to anyone who would like to receive it. After Mass there will be a special breakfast in the Parish Hall. All welcome.

FOOD BANK

To help meet the growing need for support, we would like to establish a Food Bank at Saint Bride's. Please bring all food to the CHURCH HALL at the following times: Saturdays between 4pm and 5pm and Sundays between 9am and 12noon. This will begin on Saturday 10th of June. On the first week we are looking for all tins; second week: pasta, rice and packet foods; third week: toiletries, wipes and nappies. The Food Bank also needs vouchers for Farmfoods, Iceland and Argos. The goods collected each week will be uplifted by Loaves and Fishes Food Bank. More details will be posted on the noticeboard. CALENDAR

Tuesday is the Feast of **Saint Anthony of Padua** - see front cover of the Bulletin. **Saturday** is the memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. During the Second World War, Pope Pius XII put the whole world under the special protection of Our Lady by consecrating it to her Immaculate Heart, and in 1944 he decreed that in the future the whole Church should celebrate the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, so as to obtain by her intercession: world peace, freedom for the Church, the conversion of sinners, the love of purity and the practice of virtue.
