FATHER WILLIAM FINN MC AND THE GREAT WAR

n this Remembrance Sunday, we pray for the millions who died in the wars and conflicts of the Twentieth Century and for an end to war and bloodshed in the world.

Over the past few days, I have been reading in my free time, about Catholics priests, and their participation, especially in the First World War, and what it came to mean for Catholicism in Britain in the years that followed.



One notable priest of this period was Father William Finn. He is believed to be the first Catholic chaplain killed in the Great War, when he fell in action during the Gallipoli (in modern-day Turkey) landings of April 1915.

He came from Hull, and after a period as a curate in the Cathedral, he enlisted as a chaplain and was attached to the first battalion of the Royal Dublin Fusiliers, joining them on their return from India.

They sailed from England on Saint Patrick's Day 1915 to join the rest of the 29th Division who were to be part of the landing force at Gallipoli in the Dardanelles. Their responsibility was a beach at the southern tip of the peninsula called Cape Helles. Strategically, it was a disastrous choice for a landing place. The troops were to be landed by means of a 'Trojan Horse' strategy,

which took the form of an old steam boat, the SS River Clyde, that would be run aground. A pontoon, made up of barges towed behind it, would then be anchored in a line to the shore, enabling the men to jump ashore dry and ready to fight.

Given the terrain of the beach, and the inadequate planning of the entire campaign, the landing was a complete disaster. As the men poured off the SS River Clyde into a hail of bullets, Fr Finn was ordered to remain on the boat, but seeing the men being mown down, he managed to scramble ashore in order to minister to the dying. Despite being hit by several bullets, he continued to crawl to wounded and was finally killed while giving absolution to a dying soldier. An eyewitness who survived the carnage later wrote:

Dear Joe, the worst of all was we had a priest who came along with us. He was in the boat; he insisted on coming with us, as he said he would be wanted for the poor boys. They were all calling for him, but the poor priest could do nothing for them. He got out of the boat afterwards and made a great run for the beach, but the Turks got him as soon he landed, for he was hit four times. He died that evening, but he was still asking for us up to the time he died.

Fr Finn was awarded the Military Cross, although many felt he deserved the more prestigious Victoria Cross - this was refused on the grounds that he had disobeyed orders by going ashore.

From the battalion of 25 officers and a 987 men who sailed to the Dardanelles, only one officer and 374 men survived the carnage, and by the time they left the area on 1st January 1916, only 11 of them were still alive.

The heroism of Father Finn was commonplace among Catholic chaplains in the Great War and is the reason that a higher proportion of them were killed in comparison to chaplains of other denominations who were not allowed to minister in forward positions. Frank Finn, brother of Father Finn, built the Sacred Heart Church in Hull in memory of his brother. But there was another response to the actions of the Catholic chaplains: there was a notable increase in conversions to Catholic Faith from of troops returning home 'after seeing how Catholic priests looked after the soldiers during the War'. **Father McGachey**
