# THE MARTYRS OF VIETNAM

'The blood of martyrs is the seed of Christians' Tertullian (+220AD)

riday of this week is the feast day of one hundred and seventeen saints - the Martyrs of Vietnam, who died between 1625 to 1886. Among them were ninety-six Vietnamese: priests and laity, and twenty-one missionaries, Spanish and French, priests and bishops. Some were suffocated, others burned alive or mutilated, while other died in prison after being tortured.

Catholic missionaries arrived in Vietnam at the beginning of the sixteenth century. In the two hundred years that followed, it is thought that about one hundred thousand Christians were martyred. Despite of this, during the decades of the nineteenth century, Christianity continued to grow in Vietnam, but this growth was interrupted by the persecutions unleashed by emperors Minh-Mang and Tu Dúc.

In 1832, Minh-Mang (nick-named the 'Vietnamese Nero' after the Roman Emperor who began the persecutions in Rome in 64AD), expelled all missionaries and ordered Vietnamese Christians to renounce their faith by trampling on a crucifix. Many people suffered extreme hardship or even death: the clergy were stripped naked and imprisoned in bamboo cages, tied to trees, for public mockery. Some of the laity were murdered, others endured terrible tortures, including the cutting off of their limbs, joint by joint. Their foreheads were branded withj the words *ta dao*, meaning 'false religion'.



A Vietnamese priest who suffered martyrdom during these years was Andrew Dung-Lac. Born in 1795, to a Buddhist family in North Vietnam; they moved to Hanoi where his parents could find work. There he met a catechist, and was given not only food and shelter, but a Christian education, and was baptised with the name Andrew. In 1823, he was ordained to the priesthood, and through his holiness and good example. proved the catalyst for many conversions. In 1835, he was imprisoned but his ransom was paid by donations from his congregation. To avoid further persecution, he changed his name to Dung-Lac, and moved to another region. In 1839, he was arrested again, but freed, if only briefly, in

exchange for money. He was arrested for a third time and taken to Hanoi, where he was tortured and beheaded.

Persecutions flared up again in 1847, when Christians were suspected of complicity in the national rebellion. Foreign missionaries, as well as native clergy and laity, were murdered. The most notable was the French priest, Théophane Venard. Born in 1829, he joined the Paris Mission Society, and in 1854, he was sent to Vietnam. Expelled from a province in the north in 1856, he went to Hanoi. However, the persecutions obliged him to hide in caves and sampans (boats). He was arrested, humiliated for weeks in a bamboo cage and eventually beheaded for the faith. His life story inspired Saint Therese of Lisieux to volunteer for the Carmelite community in Hanoi, but tuberculosis meant she could not go. Vénard's body is in his Order's motherhouse in Paris, but his head remains in Vietnam.

In 1862, a treaty between France and Vietnam guaranteed religious freedom in the country and marked the beginning of the end of the persecutions. The martyrs were beatified by Pope Leo XIII in 1900. In 1960, Pope Saint John XXIII established the first Catholic hierarchy in Vietnam. Today there are about 6 million Catholics in Vietnam - these are the fruits from the seed of the martyrs' blood. They were canonised in 1988 by Pope Saint John Paul II. Not surprisingly, there was no official delegation in Saint Peter's Square from the Communist regime in Vietnam for the service, but eight thousand expatriates (the so-called *Vietnamese Boat People*) from the worldwide diaspora, represented their catholic countrymen, who not were allowed to leave the country. **Father McGachey**

# THE SEASON OF ADVENT 2023 AT SAINT BRIDE'S

The Season of Advent begins this year on Sunday 3rd December. The Advent Wreath will be blessed at the beginning of all the Masses that day.

We will pray a special Litany for the Advent Season after the Rosary each morning.

On the **Tueasday** of Advent, we will have **Devotions in honour of Our Lady** at 7pm. They will begin with a Torchlight Procession from Our Lady's Altar, a *Lucernarium* (A Thanksgiving for Light), the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

On the Thursdays of Advent, we will introduce two short Novena Prayers to Saint Monica at the end of the 10am Mass - these prayers are especially for children and grandchildren who have lapsed from the practice of their faith.
