## "I WAS BORN POOR...I WILL DIE POOR" - SAINT PIUS X

Monday is the feast of Pope Saint Pius X. Born, Giuseppe Sarto, in 1825, at Riese, near Venice; the second of ten children, to parents Giovanni, a postman, and Margherita, a housewife.

A high-spirited child, he was naturally bright at school. At the age of ten, Giuseppe moved from the local village school to a high school in the neighbouring town; his day would begin at 6am by serving Mass, followed by a four mile walk to school. Conscious that money was tight, he tied his shoes around his neck, to make them last longer; he was teased by other



pupils about his shabby clothes and the poor packed lunches.

When he wsa eighteen he went to seminary at Padua. Ordained, with a special dispensation, at the age of twentythree, he served as a curate in the town of Tombolo. Here, Father Sarto was often embarrassed by his preaching, describing it as "awful"; ironically in later life he became a famous gifted preacher!

He was named Parish Priest of Salzano. Here the parishioners were rather high and mighty and were aghast when he arrived, soaked to the skin, with one small suitcase. They thought they deserved someone more prestigious! However,

he soon won the parishioners' affection.

In 1884, he was named Bishop of Mantua, something that reduced him to tears; after protesting, he was commanded in obedience, to accept the appointment. Famously, when Bishop Sarto travelled back to Riese to visit his mother, she kissed his episcopal ring and said to him: "You would not have this fine ring, son, if I did not have this", showing him her wedding ring. He was appointed Archbishop of Venice in 1892 and made a Cardinal the following year.

When Pope Leo XIII died in 1903, Cardinal Sarto had to travel to Rome for the Conclave. Before he went, he had to pawn his episcopal ring and cross to pay for his train ticket, saying that he would be back to collect them in a fortnight's time. He was elected Pope on the 4<sup>th</sup> of August 1903, taking the name Pius, explaining "As I shall suffer much, I shall take the name of those Popes who also suffered."

Noted for his simplicity, he declared that he had not changed, save for the white cassock he wore as Pope; his priest-secretaries had to remind him not to wipe his pen on it! He rose at 4am, celebrated Mass and was at his desk by 8am. At noon, he had audiences with pilgrims. For four hundred years the Popes had eaten on their own – Pius chose to change this. Resting briefly after lunch, he went back to his desk, finishing at 9pm for dinner and bed.

He encouraged the frequent reception of Holy Communion, saying that it is "medicine for those who are spiritually sick"; he reduced the age for First Communion to seven.

The outbreak of the first World War in 1914 caused him great sadness - he summoned all the seminarians in the Eternal City and told them to go home to be with their families. Shortly afterwards, he contracted bronchitis, and on the 20<sup>th</sup> of August, Pius X died. He had written in his will: "I was born poor, I have lived poor, I wish to die poor." He is buried in Saint Peter's Basilica, at the first side altar on the lefthand side. He was canonised in 1954 by Pope Pius XII, the first 'peasant Pope' in more than four hundred years.

### THE NATIONAL PILGRIMAGE IN HONOUR OF MARGARET SINCLAIR - SUNDAY 17<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER

The 2023 National Pilgrimage to pray for the Beatification of Venerable Margaret Sinclair [the Edinburgh woman, who became a Franciscan nun in London] (-1925), will take place on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> September, from 12.30pm until 6pm, at St Patrick's Church, Cowgate, Edinburgh. Refreshments and the sale of candles and goods, from 12.30pm until 1.50pm; Holy Hour with

Rosary, Confession and Benediction from 2pm; Reflection and Novena Prayers from 3pm. Holy Mass at 4.30pm. All welcome.

### CALENDAR

**Tuesday** is the 'Octave Day' of the Assumption (the Fourth Glorious Mystery), the Memorial of the **Queenship of Mary** (the Fifth Glorious Mystery). Catholic instinct has always



recognised the queenly dignity of the Mary as the mother of "The King of kings and Lord of lords." Pius XII, in 1954, established the Memorial of the Queenship of Mary.

The first canonised saint of the Americas, **Saint Rose of Lima** (+1617) is remembered on **Wednesday**. Inspired by the example of Saint Catherine of Siena, Rose became a lay member of the Dominican Order, and devoted

herself to charitable works, while living a life of poverty. Saint Martin de Porres was among her friends. She died at the age of 31.

**Friday** is the feast of **Saint Bartholomew** (also known as Nathaniel). He went with Saint Philip the Apostle to see Christ and recognised him as the Son of God. Bartholomew evangelised north-western India and Armenia. He was condemned to death.

On **Saturday** we honour **Saint Joseph Calasanz** (+1648) was born in Aragón, Spain and died in Rome. He studied law and theology and was ordained to the Priesthood. He always showed a great interest in the religious instruction of children, especially of those who were poor and neglected. In 1602 he founded the Order of Piarists.

## FABRIC MATTERS

After the cipher in the organ last Sunday at the 11.30am Mass, Allen Organs came Monday to service the instrument. It was last serviced in 2015 and is now in perfect working order. The wooden casing above side door has been replaced and the pipes lagged underneath where there was a leak last winter. Inside the porch, the ceiling has been repaired and new hatches have been added to the disabled toilet and the flower room. Some of the carpet tiles in the sacristy were badly damaged in July with a hot iron; this, along with the candle wax that has been spilled and hot charcoals that have been dropped over the years, has moved us to get a new heavy-duty carpet, which will be fitted at the beginning of September. We have also had to buy two new cruets for the water and wine at Mass since one was accidently broken during July. Could anyone give me a hand to move some items from the choir loft to the garage on Tuesday after 10am Mass, please? I am also looking for volunteers to give the choir loft a tidy and to do some sweeping and dusting.
