## THE CREATION OF TWENTY-ONE NEW CARDINALS

Pope Francis will create twenty-one new cardinals this coming Saturday. He said that the appointment of cardinals from across the globe "expresses the universality of the Church that continues to announce the merciful love of God to all men of the Earth." Cardinals serve as advisers to the Pontiff on matters of teaching and administration. But their most crucial duty is gathering in conclave to elect the next Pontiff.

Among those chosen were several prelates holding or about to assume major Vatican posts: the archbishop from La Plata, Argentina, Victor Manuel Fernández, 59, whom the Pope has recently named to lead the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith; Chicago-born Archbishop Robert Francis Prevost, 67, who heads the Congregation for the appointment of new Bishops; and Archbishop Claudio Gugerotti, 67, in charge of the Congregation for Eastern Churches, and, who until late last year, was Papal Nuncio (Ambassador) to the UK.

The Hong Kong Bishop Stephen Chou, 64 - who like Francis, is a Jesuit, and made the first visit to mainland China in nearly 30 years by a prelate in that post. Others include the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, Archbishop Pierbattista Pizzaballa, 58. Three of the churchmen chosen to receive the red hat work in Africa: they are Archbishop Stephen Brislin, 66, of Cape Town, South Africa; Archbishop Protase Rugambwa, 63, of Tabora, Tanzania; and Archbishop Stephen Mulla, 59, of Juba, South Sudan.

Others include Bishop Americo Alves Aguiar, 49, an auxiliary bishop from Lisbon, Portugal. Bishop Sebastian Francis, 71, of Penang, Malaysia; Bishop Francois-Xavier Bustillo, 54, a Franciscan from Ajaccio, on the French island of Corsica; Archbishop Luis Jose Aparicio, 71, of Bogota, Colombia; Archbishop Grzegorz Rys, 59, of Lodz, Poland; Archbishop Emil Tscherrig, 76, a Swiss prelate and the first non-Italian to serve as papal ambassador to Italy; and Archbishop Christopher Pierre, 77, who is Papal Nuncio to the USA.

Archbishop Sixto Rossi, 64, a Jesuit, of Cordoba, Argentina; Archbishop Jose Cobo Cano, 57, who was appointed archbishop of Madrid in June; and Father Angel Fernández 62, a Spaniard who is head of the Salesian Order.

Three of the new cardinals are eighty years old or older and thus not eligible to vote in a conclave. They are Italian **Archbishop Agostino Marchetto**, 82, who served as Vatican diplomat; **Archbishop Diego Padron Sanchez**, 84, of Cumana, Venezuela; and a Franciscan priest, **Luis Pascual Dri**, 96, famed for hearing confessions in the pope's native Buenos Aires and who has been praised by Francis for his emphasis on God's great mercy.

Francis has now named nine batches of new cardinals in his ten-year papacy. With the latest appointments, the number of cardinals under eighty and therefore voters in the next conclave, stands at one hundred and thirty-seven, while the overall number Cardinals stands at two hundred and twenty-one.

Tuesday is the memorial of Saints Cosmas and Damian (+303). According to tradition, they suffered martyrdom in Syria during the Roman persecution of Diocletian. They were twin brothers and medical doctors, who did not charge for their medical services. They are honoured in both the Eastern and Western Church.

Wednesday is the memorial of Saint Vincent de Paul (+1660). Born in Gascony, France, he studied theology at Toulouse and was ordained in 1600. He fell into the hands of pirates who carried him off to Africa. After his return to France, he founded the Congregation of the Priests of the Mission (Vincentians) to preach especially in rural communities. Leo XIII proclaimed him special patron of charitable institutions.

On Thursday we remember Saint Lawrence Ruiz and his companions (+1637) the seventeenth century martyrs of Nagasaki, Japan. They were nine priests, two religious, two sisters, and three laymen, including Lawrence Ruiz, a family man from the Philippines.

Friday is the feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, archangels Michael (Who is like God?) was the archangel who fought against Satan. Gabriel (the Strength of God) announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. Raphael (the Medicine of God) who took care of the Old Testament figure of Tobias.

On **Saturday** we recall **Saint Jerome** (+420). Born in Dalmatia, he was baptised in Rome, while studying. He was entrusted with the task of revising the Latin Bible, a task which took thirty years to complete. It is known as the *Vulgate* and is still used today.
