

THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

We are no doubt familiar with the Christmas song 'The Twelve days of Christmas'. To most it is a delightful nonsense rhyme set to music. But it had quite a different purpose when it was written. Between 1558 and 1892, Catholics in England were prohibited by law from practicing their faith in any public way. 'The Twelve days of Christmas' was written as one of the 'Catechism Songs' to help young Catholics learn the tenets of their faith - a memory aid, when to be caught with anything in writing indicating adherence to Catholicism would mean automatic imprisonment.

The 'true love' mentioned in the song is not an earthly suitor but God himself.

The 'me' to who the gifts are given is every baptised person.



The Partridge in a pear tree is Christ. He is symbolically presented as a mother partridge who feigns injury to decoy predators from her helpless nestlings. Remembering the expression of Christ's sadness over the fate of Jerusalem as he travelled along the streets of Jerusalem in the direction of Calvary: "Jerusalem! Jerusalem! How often would I have sheltered you under my wings, as a hen does her chicks, but you would not listen!"

The two Turtle Doves are the Old and New Testaments of the Bible.

The three French Hens are the theological virtues: Faith,

Hope and Charity.

The four Calling Birds are the four Evangelists: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

The five Gold Rings are the first five books of the Bible known as the 'Pentateuch': Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy.

The six Geese a-laying are the six days during which God created the world.

The seven Swans a-swimming are the seven Sacraments: Baptism, Penance, Confirmation, Eucharist, Holy Orders and Marriage.

The eight Maids a-milking are the eight Beatitudes in Saint Matthew's Gospel: Happy the poor in spirit...; Happy the merciful...; Happy the gentle...; Happy the pure in heart etc.

The nine Ladies dancing are the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

The ten Lords a-leaping are the Ten Commandments.

The eleven Pipers piping are the eleven faithful Apostles: Peter, James, John, Andrew, Philip, Matthew, Thomas, James the son of Alpheus, Bartholomew, Jude Thaddeus and Simon.

The twelve Drummers drumming are the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostles' Creed, the Creed we profess on a Sunday and Solemnity. Father McGachey

CALENDAR

The days of Christmas Week are known as Octave of Christmas. Like Easter, Christmas is followed by eight days of solemn and joyous celebration which will end on January 1st with the Feast of Mary, the Mother of God. Saint Stephen is honoured on Tuesday. Known as the 'Proto-Martyr', he was the first follower of the Lord to be martyred. Saint John the Apostle and Evangelist is remembered on Wednesday. Described in his Gospel as the "beloved disciple" who rested on Our Lord's side during the Last Supper. The Holy Innocents - the male children of Judea who were slaughtered at Herod's order in his search for the Christ-child - whose feast falls on Thursday. Friday is the



memorial of Saint Thomas Beckett (pictured). He was the Archbishop of Canterbury who was killed in 1170 by the King Henry II's soldiers, after the king exclaimed "Who will rid me of this turbulent priest?"
