Bulletin for the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King - 26th November 2023

'VIVA CRISTO REY...'

Today is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King, and the last Sunday of the Church's liturgical year.



None of us will remember the Holy Year of 1925, or the political situation which was the background to the teaching of the Pope of those days, Pius XI: in Russia, the Bolsheviks, and in Mexico, extreme left-wing politicians, had established atheistic regimes, bent on the eradication of all religion, sending priests and laity to death or exile in persecutions as terrible as any since the time of the Roman Emperors.

These events came with the potential for evil, with regimes which demanded unconditional loyalty to the State - things which Pope Pius XI was later to condemn.

In these circumstances the Pope wrote the letter '*Quas Primas'* (*In the first*) which described the events and successes of the Holy Year that had passed, and proclaimed, as a climax to that Year, a new feast of the *Kingship of Jesus Christ*.

The Pope fully realised that the liturgy - for instance in the feast of the Ascension already celebrated the Kingship of Jesus foretold in the Old Testament prophecies. His kingship was referred to often in the Gospels: the angel Gabriel said 'Of his kingdom there will be no end'; or when Jesus himself would say 'All power has been given to me in Heaven and on earth' and then to Pontius Pilate 'Yes, I am a king,' but 'my Kingdom is not of this world'. Pius XI stated that this Kingdom of Christ must oppose regimes, whose basis was the abolition of God, not by material force, but with the weapons of prayer, pardon and peace.

He went on to explain that loyalty to Christ must have first place in our hearts, and that governments must accept that they have no claim on the conscience of believers. Our Catholic faith is rooted firmly in Jesus of Nazareth, who was not a dictator. Worldly kingdoms will come and go; the kingdom of Jesus will never pass away. The Pope felt it was time to have a special feast to celebrate all of this.

The icon pictured above is one found on the *Book of the Gospels*, which we will use at Mass today. It is a fitting image of Christ's kingship since the Greek letters 'IC XC' mean 'Jesus Christ' and 'NIKA' means 'conquers' (hence the name of the sports brand 'Nike' meaning 'to conquer'). They correspond to the Latin 'Christus Vincit' and remind us how a hundred years ago, priests and believers in Mexico and Spain faced death with the cry 'Viva Cristo Rey', 'Long live Christ the King' on their lips.

MONDAY 27TH NOVEMBER - FEAST OF THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL



Monday is the feast of the Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal. On the 27th November 1830, at the convent of the Daughters of Charity, on the Rue du Bac, Paris, Our Lady appeared to Saint Catherine Labouré, a novice in the community. She showed Catherine the design of a medal that she wanted to be made and distributed to all the world (see opposite). The medal was initially known as the Medal of the Immaculate Conception, but due to the many miracles that the medal

seemed to produce, it received the popular title of 'The Miraculous Medal.'

I am grateful to the Parish Legion of Mary for having procured several hundred Miraculous Medals. Please take these for yourself and pass them on to your family and friends. There are leaflets with the Novena Prayers and the history of this devotion, please take these too. At the end of Mass, I will bless the Miraculous Medals and say the Prayers of Enrolment. We will conclude by saying our weekly Novena Prayers to Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal.

THURSDAY 30th NOVEMBER - SAINT ANDREW'S DAY

Thursday is the feast of **Saint Andrew**, Apostle and Patron of Scotland. A native of Bethsaida, a fisherman by trade, and a disciple of John the Baptist, he introduced his brother Peter to Jesus. After Pentecost, Andrew is said to have been martyred at Patras in Greece, on a cross which was in the form of an X known as 'Saint Andrew's cross.'

Our Mass on Thursday morning will be a Solemn Mass with organ and incense to honour Saint Andrew. Bishop Toal will say Mass on Thursday at 11.45am for Saint Andrew's and Saint Bride's High School in honour of their co-patron.

THE SEASON OF ADVENT 2023 AT SAINT BRIDE'S

The Season of Advent begins next Sunday. The Advent Wreath will be blessed at the beginning of all the Masses that day.

We will pray a special Litany for the Advent Season after the Rosary each morning.

On the **Tuesdays** of Advent, we will have **Devotions in honour of Our Lady** at 7pm. They will begin with a Torchlight Procession from Our Lady's Altar, a *Lucernarium* (A Thanksgiving for Light), the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. [Please note the change of day from Monday to Tuesday].

On the **Thursdays** of Advent, we will introduce two short **Novena Prayers to Saint Monica** at the end of the 10am Mass - these prayers are especially for children and grandchildren who have lapsed from the practice of their faith. I am sure we all have some such people in our families who need our prayers.
