# JUNE - MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

he human heart beats on average over 2.6 billion times in the course of an average life. The heart is a powerful metaphor in the Bible: it signfies the completeness of a person's being. The prophet Ezekiel, for instance, records God's promise to change Israel's heart of stone into a heart of flesh, while John's Gospel gives the heart its most profound scriptural expression: Jesus' heart is the source of living water; it is a place of rest for the Beloved Disciple; it is the source of the Church's sacraments flowing from his body on the cross, and of doubting Thomas' faith.



Devotion to the Sacred Heart began to flourish in the Middle Ages through a renewed attentiveness to Jesus' humanity and his Passion. Its golden age, though, was the 17th century, when Saint Francis de Sales, Saint John Eudes and Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque offered a tender spirituality that helped to renew the Church. From 1673 to 1675 at the Visitation convent of Paray-le-Monial, France, Saint Margaret Mary received a series of four revelations from Christ about his Heart.

During these revelations Christ explained to her the way in which he wanted people to honour his Heart: he asked for it to be reverenced through the symbol of a heart of flesh; he asked for acts of reparation for the offences committed against his Heart; for frequent Holy Communion, especially on the first Friday of each month, and that people should keep a Holy Hour

in memory of the time he spent in the garden of Gethsemane after the Last Supper. In the revelations St. Margaret Mary received, Jesus made twelve promises for those who honour his Heart:

- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
- 2. I will establish peace in their families.
- 3. I will console them in all their troubles.
- 4. They shall find in my Heart an assured refuge during life and especially at the hour of their death.
- 5. I will pour abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners shall find in my Heart the source of an infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall speedily rise to great perfection.
- 9. I will bless the homes where an image of my Heart shall be exposed and honoured.
- 10. I will give to priests the power of touching the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Those who propagate this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart, never to be effaced.
- 12. The all-powerful love of my Heart will grant to all those who shall receive Communion on the First Friday of nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die under my displeasure, nor without receiving their Sacraments; my heart shall be their assured refuge at that last hour.

# **TODAY IS PENTECOST SUNDAY**

Today is the fiftieth day after Easter Sunday and the Solemnity of Pentecost when we recall the coming of the Holy Spirit on Our Lady and the Apostles, recorded by Saint Luke in the Acts of the Apostles. The Pentecost event is closely linked with the Sacrament of Confirmation, for this reason we will renew our confirmation promises at Mass today.

At the end of all Masses this weekend we will offer an anointing with the Oil of Gladness which will be given to anyone who would wish to receive it. This anointing is mentioned in the

Prophet Isaiah when he says, "To grant those who mourn in Zion, giving them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning." In the Old Testament this anointing was considered as a powerful means of transmitting the gift of God's Spirit.

Unlike the Sacrament of the Sick, everyone is eligible to be anointed with the Oil of Gladness for spiritual, mental, emotional and physical healing. All of us can benefit from this spiritual healing. I hope that many of you will come to receive this blessing.

## **CALENDAR**

Monday is the memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church - this ancient devotion to Our Lady was inserted into the Roman Calendar by Pope Francis several years ago. Today is also the memorial of Pope Saint Paul VI. Giovanni Battista Montini was born in 1897, in a village near Brescia, Italy. He became Pope in 1963 and presided over the completion of the Second Vatican Council. He died on 6<sup>th</sup> of August, the Feast of the Transfiguration, 1978.

Wednesday is the Feast of the Visitation, that is to say, when Our Lady visited her cousin Elizabeth shortly after the Annunciation. When Mary greeted Elizabeth, John the Baptist was cleansed from original sin in the womb of his mother. Elizabeth proclaimed Mary "blessed among women" and Mary sang her hymn (called the *Magnificat*) "My soul magnifies the Lord" which has become a part of the daily prayer of the Church every evening at Vespers.

Thursday is the memorial of Saint Justin, martyr (100-165), who was one of the most important Christian writers of the second century. He was put to death in Rome.

Friday is the memorial of the early Roman martyrs, Saints Marcellinus and Peter. Saint Charles Lwanga and his twenty-one Companions (1886-1887) are remembered on Saturday. They were among a group of around one hundred Catholics and Protestants who were murdered in Uganda by the vicious King Mwanga. Canonised by Paul VI in 1964, they are the first martyrs of Black Africa.
