THE AMERICAN TELE-EVANGELIST AND SCOTLAND

Peter John Sheen was born in 1895 in El Paso, Illinois, the eldest of four siblings. He adopted his mother's maiden name, 'Fulton', in honour of his uncle, who funded his seminary education, and so was popularly known as Fulton Sheen. The family moved to nearby Peoria, Illinois, where he was an altar boy in the local cathedral. Feeling called to the Priesthood, he pursued his vocation in Minnesota, and was ordained in 1919.



After ordination he was sent to do further studies at *The Catholic University of America*, Washington DC. He went on to earn two doctorates: one from the *Catholic University* of Leuven, Belgium, and the other from the Dominican University in Rome, the *Angelicum*. After completing his academic work on the Continent, he become curate at Saint Patrick's, Soho Square, London, while teaching theology at Saint Edmund's Seminary, Ware in Hertfordshire. It was during this time that he came to Carfin Grotto, and was afforded the honour of leading a major

Procession and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament by Canon Thomas Taylor, Guardian of the Grotto - see the photographs. He returned to DC, where he taught philosophy until 1950. A year later he was consecrated auxiliary bishop of New York, where he served until 1965.

Sheen wrote the first of seventy-three books in 1925, and in 1930, began a weekly Sunday night radio broadcast called *The Catholic Hour*. Two decades later, the broadcast had a weekly listening

audience of four million people. In 1951, he presented a weekly television programme, *Life is Worth Living* - he would speak in front of a live audience without a script, using a blackboard to illustrate his points. Old episodes are broadcast of the EWTN channel in the UK.

In 1952, he won an Emmy Award for his efforts on television. He humourously said in his acceptance speech, "I feel it is time I paid tribute to my four writers: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John." At its peak, the programme had massive weekly audience of thirty million viewers.

In 1958, he became director of the *Mission Society* in the United States: he donated \$10 million to the missionary efforts of the Church from the royalties he earned from the books he had written. He was appointed Bishop of Rochester, upstate New York, in 1966.



Sheen was credited with helping convert a number of notable figures to Catholicism, including the car dealer Henry Ford; also *The West Wing* political drama actor Martin Sheen, whose birth name is Ramón Estévez - the stage name he adopted in honour of the Archbishop whose radio broadcasts he listened to when he was a child.

In 1979, two months before Sheen's death, Pope Saint John Paul II visited Saint Patrick's Cathedral, New York. He spied Sheen amongst the dozens of bishops assembled on the sanctuary area; he walked over to him, and embraced him, saying, "You have written and spoken well of the Lord Jesus. You are a loyal son of the Church."

As well as visiting Carfin, Sheen had another connection with Scotland. On his prayer desk, in his private chapel, he had the twenty-two volumes of Professor William Barclay's (he was from Motherwell, taught Divinity at Glasgow University and had his own tv programme on the BBC in the 1960s) commentaries on the New Testament. Sheen says in his autobiography *Feet of Clay* (an excellent read), that he never preached a homily without first consulting what Barclay had written.

Whenever he was invited to the ordination of a priest, he always gifted the twenty-two volumes to new priest. Fulton Sheen died on the 9th December 1979.


THE FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTIONS IN HONOUR OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA
