Bulletin for the Twenty-Second Sunday of the Ordinary Season - 3rd September 2023

CARFIN GROTTO AND FATHER THOMAS TAYLOR

For more than a hundred years, the Grotto at Carfin has been a special place of pilgrimage. In July 1920, a group of parishioners from Saint Francis Xavier's parish, Carfin, took part in the Scottish National Pilgrimage to Lourdes. Upon their return, they decided to build a small shrine, on an acre of ground across from the old parish Church: in September 1920, the first sod was cut and the site was blessed; the next day volunteers set to work, including many local men who were idle during a time of strikes and mass unemployment.

By September 1922, statues of Our Lady of Lourdes and Saint Bernadette had arrived, along with a tiny piece of rock from the niche where Our Lady had appeared at Lourdes. Over two thousand pilgrims watched Father Thomas Taylor (pictured) consecrate the Lourdes Grotto.

He was born at Greenock in 1873, where his father James, was Head Teacher at Saint Lawrence's Primary School. He was the eldest of four brothers, three of whom went on to become priests: Thomas, Alexander and James; while Henry became the father of a priest. He began his studies at Saint Mary's College, Blairs in 1889, and continued them at Saint Sulpice Seminary, Paris, where he was ordained in 1896.

Returning to Scotland Father Taylor was sent as curate to Saint Patrick's, Dumbarton. Four years later, he was appointed professor at Saint Peter's College, Bearsden and 1915, he



was made Parish Priest of Saint Francis Xavier's, Carfin, a post he held for forty-eight years.

In 1893, he had made a pilgrimage to Lourdes, and this was the beginning of his love for the shrine in the Pyrenees: while lecturing in Bearsden he published a book entitled *Lourdes and its Miracles*, which helped to make Lourdes better known in Scotland.

The Grotto was formally opened on 1st October 1922, and

through it he was able to promote devotion not only to Our Lady of Lourdes but also to Saint Thérèse of Lisieux; he was in fact a close friend of the Saint's three blood sisters in the Carmel at Lisieux. Moreover in 1911, he was called as one of the principal witnesses to the widespread devotion to the 'Little Flower', as Saint Thérèse had become known, in the English-speaking world when the cause for her canonisation was opened.

Perhaps Father Taylor's most famous book was his translation of *L'Histoire d'une ame* (The Story of a Soul), the autobiography of Saint Thérèse. It was given a tremendous reception by English speakers, as was its successor *A Little White Flower*, with one reprint following another. He had the privilege of being present at her canonisation in Rome in 1925. Monsignor Taylor died on 1st December 1963 and is buried at Saint Patrick's, New Stevenston.

Since its inception, many thousands of people, through their prayers, sacrifices, practical help and financial generosity have helped to sustain and expand the Grotto. Open 365 days a year, the Grotto attract pilgrims from across the country and around the world. The National Pilgrimage takes place today at the Grotto beginning at 3pm. Father McGachey
