REMEMBERING THE WORDS OF POPE SAINT JOHN PAUL II AT BELLAHOUSTON IN 1982

orty-one years ago, almost to the day, on a glorious summer afternoon, Archbishop Thomas Winning welcomed Pope John Paul II to Bellahouston Park, where nearly 300,000 people from all over Scotland gave the Holy Father a tumultuous welcome. At one point during the Pope's homily the crowd, the largest ever assembled in Scotland, applauded him for nearly eight minutes. The message he delivered then is still relevant for Scottish Catholics today:



"We are gathered here on this Scottish hillside to celebrate Mass. Are we not like those first followers who sat at the feet of Jesus on the hillside near Capernaum? With words simple and clear, Jesus outlined the requirements for admission to his heavenly kingdom: to be gentle, generous, simple, and above all sincere. To avoid being arrogant, censorious, or self-seeking. To aim for the Kingdom requires a radical change in outlook, in behaviour, in relations with others.

Be loyal to the memory of those valiant forerunners in the Faith. Be diligent in handing on intact the spiritual heritage committed to you. Be faithful to your daily prayers, to the Mass, to the Sacrament of Penance... Defend the sacredness of life and the holiness of matrimony. Understand your holy Catholic faith and live by its teaching. Face up to the difficult challenges of modern life with Christian fortitude and patience.

You are heirs to a sacred heritage. Your forefathers have handed on to you the only inheritance they really prized, our holy Catholic faith! From heaven their heartfelt appeal to you would be this: 'Set your hearts on his kingdom'. With grateful hearts turn to God and thank him that tranquil days have been restored to the Catholic community in Scotland. And for your dearly beloved Scottish homeland, I wish to adapt and make my own the words familiar to many of you: Lord, let Scotland flourish through the preaching of thy word and the praising of thy name. Amen!"

ANNUAL PILGRIMAGE TO SCALAN

The annual Pilgrimage to Scalan takes place on Sunday 2nd of July, with an open air Mass at Scalan, beginning promptly at 4pm. Scalan can be found a mile beyond Chapeltown in Glenlivet. An approximate postcode is AB37 9JS. Coaches need to stop half a mile beyond Chapeltown. Cars and minibuses can park very near and are usually willing to take anyone needing a lift.

CALENDAR



On Monday the Church celebrates the memorial Saint Boniface (+754), a monk of Exeter. Boniface is one of the great figures of the Benedictine Order in the Middle Ages. Pope Gregory II sent him to preach the Gospel in Germany; He was put to death by the Frisians during the last of his missionary journeys. The famous abbey of Fulda, where his body lies, has

remained the national shrine of Catholic Germany.

Tuesday is the memorial of **Saint Norbert** (+1134). Norbert was born at Xanten near Cologne about the year 1080. He was caught one day in a terrible thunderstorm during a journey on horseback and he made up his mind to take his clerical obligations seriously. After ordination to the Priesthood, he devoted himself to itinerant preaching. He would settle in the forest near Soissons, at a place called Premontre, in order to found a community of monks, known today as the Premonstratesians.

The Church celebrates the memorial of **Saint Ephrem**, Deacon (+373), called 'the Harp of the Holy Spirit.' As deacon at Edessa, he combatted the heresies of his time, and to do so more effectively wrote poems and hymns about the mysteries of Christ, Our Lady and the saints. He was a commentator on Scripture and a preacher as well as a poet.

Saint Columba or Columkille (+597). After being ordained to the priesthood, and having founded many churches in Ireland, he went to Scotland with twelve companions, and there converted many of the northern Picts to the faith of Christ. He founded the monastery of lona which became the nursery of saints.

MASS FOR THE SICK

On Thursday 22nd of June, the Feast of the English martyrs Saints John Fisher and Thomas More, we will have a special Mass during which the Sacrament of the Sick will be given to anyone who would like to receive it. After Mass there will be a special breakfast in the Parish Hall. All welcome.
