

SAINT JOHN HENRY NEWMAN

John Henry Newman, theologian and scholar, who was one of the highest profile Anglicans to convert to Catholicism during the Victorian era, in 2019 became Britain's first saint since 1976, when the Scot, Saint John Ogilvie, was canonised.

Born in London in 1801, his father was a banker from the Evangelical wing of the Anglican Church. At the age of fifteen Newman experienced a deep religious conversion which would become the foundation of his lifelong faith in God. He matriculated at Trinity College, Oxford, and then applied for a fellowship at Oriel College. Around this time he was ordained a priest in the Church of England, working for seventeen years as vicar of the University Church of Saint Mary the Virgin.

In these years he published eight volumes of *Parochial and Plain Sermons* as well as two novels; and his poem, *The Dream of Gerontius* (from the Latin meaning 'old man') which was set to music by the Catholic composer Sir Edward Elgar.



After 1833, Newman was a prominent member of the *Oxford Movement*, which emphasised the Church's debt to the Church Fathers (the great writers of the first eight centuries). Historical research made Newman suspect that the Roman Catholic Church was in closest continuity with the Church that Jesus established.

In 1845, he became a Roman Catholic with the help of the Italian priest Blessed Dominic Barberi. Two years later he was ordained a Catholic priest in Rome and joined the *Congregation of the Oratory*, founded three centuries earlier by Saint Philip Neri. Returning to England, he founded Oratory houses in Birmingham and London, and for seven years served as Rector of the Catholic University of Ireland.

Newman would write forty books and more than twenty thousand letters all of which survive today. His two most famous works are his *Essay on the Development of Christian Doctrine*, and his *Apologia Pro Vita Sua* (his spiritual autobiography up to 1864). He accepted the First Vatican Council's teaching on Papal Infallibility while noting its limits - which many people who favoured that definition were reluctant to do.

When Newman was named a Cardinal in 1879, he took as his motto 'Cor ad cor loquitur' (Heart speaks to heart). He died in 1890 at the age of eighty-nine. More than fifteen thousand people lined the streets for his funeral.

Pope Benedict XVI beatified Newman in September 2010, at Crofton Park, near Birmingham. While underling his great intellect, Benedict also praised his pastoral zeal for the sick, the poor, the bereaved and those in prison. Newman was canonised in 2019 by Pope Francis. Father McGachey

PILGRIMAGE IN HONOUR OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

Will take place on Friday of this week at Saint Francis Xavier's, Carfin, 13th October, beginning at 7.30pm with a Rosary Procession, followed by Holy Mass and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. At the end of the evening the traditional Fatima 'Adeus' or 'Farewell' will take place.

CALENDAR

Tuesday is the memorial of Saint Denis (+258), Bishop of Paris. He suffered martyrdom there, together with his priest Rusticus and his deacon Eleutherius. It is also the memorial of Saint John Henry Cardinal Newman (+1890) - see front cover. On Thursday we remember St. John XXIII, pope from 1958-1963, best known for convening the Second Vatican Council. Saturday is the memorial of St. Edward, the Confessor (+1066). He became king of England at the age of forty-seven. Noted for his gentleness, humility and detachment, his reign was one of almost continuous peace.
