KNOCK AND THE APPARITIONS OF 1879

Peirne were walking back home in the rain, when they passed by the gable wall of Saint John the Baptist Church in Knock, a village in County Mayo, Western Ireland. There, against the south wall of the Church, was an apparition of Our Lady, Saint Joseph and Saint John the Evangelist. Behind them, a little to the left of Saint John, was an altar, on top of which was a cross and a Lamb with adoring angels. The two women called a small group of people who were in the street nearby. A total fifteen people gathered; their ages ranged from five years to seventy-five, including men, women, teenagers and children.



Our Lady was described as being "very beautiful", standing a few feet above the ground. She wore a white cloak, and on her head there was a gold crown; the upper parts of the crown appeared to be a series of glittering crosses. Those who saw the apparition said that she looked to be deep in prayer, with her eyes raised to heaven. Saint Joseph, also wearing white robes, stood at Our Lady's right, his head bent forward from the shoulders towards Our Lady. Saint John the Evangelist stood to the left of Our Lady; he was dressed in

a long robe and wore a mitre (the head gear of a bishop) He was partly turned away from the other figures and appeared to be preaching; he held open a large book in his left hand. To the left of Saint John was an altar with a lamb (the Lamb of God) on it with a cross standing on the altar behind the lamb.

Those who witnessed the apparition stood in the pouring rain for up to two hours reciting the Rosary. When the apparition started, there was good light in the early evening, but although it became dark, the witnesses could still see the figures very clearly. The apparition did not flicker or move in any way. The Church investigated these apparitions at Knock in 1879, and again in 1936. It found that the witnesses were credible and that they testimony they gave was believable and that there was nothing contrary to the Faith.

Five recent popes have honoured Knock. Pius XII blessed the banner of Knock at Saint Peter's on All Saints' Day in the Marian Year of 1945. Pope John XXIII, who had a special devotion to Knock, presented the shrine with a commemorative candle on Candlemas Day, 2nd February 1960. Pope Paul VI blessed the foundation stone of the Basilica in 1974. Pope John Paul II went to Knock in 1979, where he celebrated Holy Mass, and established the shrine church as a Basilica. Afterwards he presented a candle and a Golden Rose to the shrine and knelt in prayer at the apparition wall (pictured above) In 2018 Pope Francis visited the shrine at Knock during his Apostolic visit to Ireland for the World Meeting of Families. The feast of Our Lady of Knock is on the 17th August. Father McGachey

CALENDAR



Tuesday is the memorial of Saint Bernard (+1153). He was a Cistercian monk at Clairvaux in France. A theologian, poet, orator, and writer, he composed the prayer, the 'Memorare'. Wednesday is the memorial of Pope Saint Pius X (+1914). Born in huumble circumstances in Northern Italy, he was: curate, parish priest, bishop and Patriarch of Venice. Elected in Pope in 1903, he influenced every aspect of the Church's life and worship. Thursday is the 'Octave Day' of the Assumption (the Fourth Glorious Mystery), the Memorial

of the Queenship of Mary (the Fifth Glorious Mystery). Catholic instinct has always recognised the queenly dignity of the Mary as the mother of "The King of kings and Lord of lords." The first canonised saint of the Americas, Saint Rose of Lima (+1617) is remembered on Friday. Inspired by the example of Saint Catherine of Siena, Rose became a lay member of the Dominican Order, and devoted herself to charitable works, while living a life of poverty. Saint Martin de Porres was among her friends. She died at the age of 31. Saturday is the feast of Saint Bartholomew (also known as Nathaniel). He went with Saint Philip the Apostle to see Christ and recognised hm as the Son of God.

THREE DAY VISIT OF APOSTOLIC NUNCIO TO MOTHERWELL



We will have the three-day Pastoral Visit of Archbishop Miguel Maury Buendia (pictured), the Apostolic Nuncio to Great Britain, to the Diocese of Motherwell at the end of this month The Solemn Mass of Welcome will be in the Cathedral at 7pm on Friday 30th August. The following morning, Saturday, there will be a Mass in honour of Our Lady at 10am in the Cathedral, celebrated by the Nuncio. The visit concludes with the National

Pilgrimage Mass at Our Lady of Lourdes' Grotto, Carfin, at 3pm on Sunday 1st September. The Papal Nuncio will be the main celebrant and Bishop Frank Dougan the homilist. The theme for the Pilgrimage is *Pilgrims of Prayer* in preparation for the Jubilee Year of 2025. All are welcome to attend any or all of these events, and you are encouraged to do so. In common with other parishes, there will be 10am Mass on the Saturday morning.
