# ASSUMPTA EST IN CAELUM VIRGO MARIA...

n Friday the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Lady into heaven. It is the oldest feast day of Our Lady in the Church's calendar, whose origin is lost in those days when Jerusalem was restored as a holy place during the reign of the Emperor Constantine, that is to say, from the year 312AD onwards.

In 135AD the Emperor Hadrian (the same one who ordered the building of 'Hadrian's Wall' stretching from the Solway Firth to the River Tyne, as the northerly border in Britannia in 122AD) obliterated all trace of Jesus from the Jerusalem, and built temples dedicated to the Roman God's over the holy places associated with his life.

In the Fourth century, after the Roman Empire had embraced Christianity, the pagan temples were destroyed, and basilicas began to be built to commemorate the events of Our Lord's life on the same spots. Jesus' mother Mary was not forgotten. Memories of her centred around the so-called 'Tomb of Mary' - near the site where the Jewish Temple had once stood - it was called the place of her 'dormition' or 'falling asleep', that is, where Mary is said to have died, the tomb being her burial spot. Today the Abbey of the Dormition, run by German Benedictines, is found here.



Mary's death began to be celebrated by the Christian community in Jerusalem in the fourth century; by the seventh century it was being celebrated in Rome under the title of the 'Falling Asleep', or 'Dormitio', in Latin, of the Mother of God.

Soon the name was changed to the 'Assumption of Mary', since there was more to the feast than her dying: the

feast began to underline the belief that Mary "had been taken up, body and soul, into heaven." That belief dated back to the time of the Apostles themselves. in 451AD, when bishops from the Mediterranean world gathered in Constantinople for a Council, the Emperor Marcian asked the Bishop of Jerusalem to bring the relics of Mary with him. The Bishop explained to the Emperor that there were no relics of Mary in Jerusalem: Mary had died in the presence of the apostles; but her tomb; when opened later was found empty, and so the apostles concluded that the body was taken up into heaven.

In 1950, in the Apostolic Constitution *Munificentissimus Deus* (the Most Generous God) Pope Pius XII proclaimed the Assumption of Mary a dogma of the Catholic Church in these words: "The Immaculate Mother of God, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heaven."

Why? The Assumption completes God's work in her since it was not fitting that the flesh, which had given life to God's Son, Jesus, should ever undergo the corruption of death. So, the feast turns our eyes in the direction of heaven - where Mary has gone, we hope to follow. Father McGachey

### **CALENDAR**

Monday is the memorial Saint Clare of Assisi (+1253). She was the first female to practice the life of poverty as taught by Saint Francis. Placed by him at the head of a few companions in the small convent of San Damiano, she governed her community for forty-two years thus founding the Order of Poor Clares. Thursday is memorial of Saint Maximilian Kolbe (+1941). Born in Poland, he joined the Franciscan Order and founded the Militia of Mary Immaculate to promote devotion to the Mother of God. He was an outspoken critic of the Nazis. As a result, he was imprisoned in Auschwitz, where he would volunteer to take the place of the father of a large family who was to be executed in 1941. He was canonised by Pope Saint John Paul. Friday is the Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Lady into heaven - see front cover. We honour the Christian King, Saint Stephen of Hungary (+1038) on Saturday. Through his holiness and zeal, he consolidated the Christian Faith in his country, founding Dioceses and Monasteries.
