TWO NEW SAINTS FOR THE CHURCH

n Sunday morning Pope Leo will create the first Saints of his Pontificate: Pier Giorgio Frassati (+1925) and Carlo Acutis (+2006). What was it that made these young men holy and why are they being raised to the altars today?



Pier Giorgio Frassati was born in 1901, into a middle-class family in Turin: his parents, Alfredo, was the founder of the daily newspaper *La Stampa* and a Senator in the Italian Parliament, and his mother Adelaide, an artist, were not religious and often misunderstood and even disapproved of his piety and interest in Catholicism. He had learned this from the nannies who brought him up. He had a solid prayer life, reciting the Rosary nightly on his knees by his bedside; he went regularly to Confession, and he even requested the special permission to receive Holy Communion every day at the Jesuit school he attended - a privilege rarely given in those days.

Although from a wealthy background, Pier Giorgio had a real desire to help the poor. As a child, when a poor woman with her young son came to his door begging, Pier Giorgio took off his shoes and gave them to the boy. In his student days he joined the Saint Vincent de Paul Society, visiting the poorest neighbourhoods of Turin on a regular basis. He was a man of action, insisting that "Charity is not enough; we need social reform". He even launched a newspaper, called *Momento*, which derived its interests from Pope Leo XIII's great writing on the Social teaching of the Church, *Rerum Novarum* (New Things).

Pier Giorgio was handsome and had a vibrant personality - characteristics that drew people to him. He shared his faith with ease, and had a love for sports, especially mountaineering.

The parental misunderstandings, which were very painful to him, persisted until the day of his sudden death from polio. When news of his passing reached the Frassatis, they had no

idea about the generous nature of their son, and were astonished to see thousands of people gathered outside their mansion on the day of his funeral Mass. In 1981, Pier Giorgio's remains were found to be incorrupt and were transferred to the Cathedral of Turin. His time on earth was short - only 24 years - but he filled it passionately with holy living and active concern for others.

Carlo Acutis was born in London in 1991, where is father, Andrea, worked in insurance, and his mother, Annunciata, in publishing. Before long the family relocated to Milan. Unfortunately, both parents rarely attended Holy Mass, but Carlo's inquisitive nature and interest in the faith brought them back to the Church.



Carlo struggled academically at school; and was often bullied. When advised to stand-up for himself, he replied that "Jesus would not be happy if I lost my temper." He had a great devotion to the Saints: his heroes were Francis of Assisi, Francisco and Jacinta Marto (the Fatima visionaries), Dominic Savio, Bernadette Soubirous, and Michael the Archangel.

It was common in those days for youngsters to be catechised by other youngsters, and Carlo became a catechist at the age of twelve. Then the local priest asked him to create a web site for the parish when he was fourteen. Later, his high school asked him to do the same thing, to help promote good causes. Honing his skills, he also worked for several years on a website to promote Eucharistic miracles around the world. He involved his whole family in this project, which finally opened online to the public in 2006.

By October 1st 2006, Carlo was diagnosed with leukaemia. After falling into a coma, he died within a week. He wanted to be buried in Assisi, so his body was moved there in 2019.

them, and for a just and lasting peace. The must think that the world has forgotten them.



On **Monday** the Church celebrates the **Birth of Our Blessed Lady**, nine months after the 8th December, her Immaculate Conception. **Tuesday** is the memorial of **Saint Peter Claver**, the Spanish Jesuit, sent to Colombia, who for thirty-three years cared for the sick and dying slaves there. **Thursday** is the memorial of the **Holy Name of Mary**. Saint Bernard, in the Middle Ages, said of Mary: "Look to the star of the sea, call upon Mary., in times of joy and sorrow, call upon the name of Mary." **Saint John Chrysostom** (+407) is remembered on **Saturday**. His eloquence earned him the nickname *chrysostom*, or golden mouthed. As Archbishop of Constantinople, his courageous stance against the vices of the wealthy caused him to be exiled several times.
